

## Longue Vue Iris Festival, Jean Lafitte Celebration Highlight Spring Iris Weekend

The Greater New Orleans Iris Society and Longue Vue House and Garden are teaming up for a Louisiana iris "mini-festival" on Saturday morning, April 9. From 9:00 to 11:30 AM, the public is welcome to attend slide presentations, iris culture demonstrations and take a guided walk among the Louisiana irises in the Wild Garden at Longue Vue. There will be a \$3 general admission, but the festival is free for members of Longue Vue and GNOIS.

In the afternoon, three GNOIS member gardens will be open to the public from 1:30 until 4:30. And, with the annual Celebration of the Louisiana Iris in

Jean Lafitte on Sunday, the weekend could not offer a wider array of opportunities to see Louisiana irises in different settings.

#### **Events**

The schedule for the Longue Vue Festival will be compact. There will be two different slide presentations but the culture demonstration will occur at two times, as will the guided stroll along Longue Vue's Louisiana Iris Walk. One of the slide presentations will emphasize the species and older irises and the other will show more of the modern hybrids available to gardeners.

### Louisiana Iris Celebration April 10 in Jean Lafitte

On Sunday, April 10 from 9:00 until 5:00, the Better Swamps and Garden Club will sponsor the 9th Annual Celebration of the Louisiana Iris in the communities of Lafitte, Barataria and Crown Point.

The Celebration offers garden tours, a nature walk, talks by Dan Gill and Eileen Hollander, and irises for sale. There are seven stops on the tour this year, including Victoria Inn and Gardens. The new Jean Lafitte Nature Park, featuring an elevated boardwalk through the marsh and among the irises, by itself would be worth the short 20 mile drive to Jean Lafitte.

The starting point for the self-guided tour is the Tourist Center in Jean Lafitte. Tickets are \$8. A bus tour starting at the Center also is available, and it includes lunch at Victoria Inn. Tickets for the Continued on page 3

The irises at Longue Vue are particularly varied, with representatives of the native species, collected hybrids and older cultivars growing alongside newer varieties. The Iris Walk curves for nearly a hundred yards through the Wild Garden. It is a beautiful sight when the Louisianas are in bloom, but with a wide variety of native plants, it is very nice year round.

The gardens at Longue Vue were designed by renowned landscape architect Ellen Biddle Shipman, and the Wild Garden was planted originally by Caroline Dorman, a conservationist and early collector and hybridizer of Louisi-

bus tour are \$25 and are available on a first-come, first-served basis by calling 689-4233.

The talks by Dan Gill and Eileen Hollander are scheduled for 10:45 and 11:15 AM and will be repeated at 2:15 and 2:45 PM. Dan will discuss a broad range of garden topics and Eileen will focus on Louisiana irises.

The Lafitte communities are unique, and a trip there at iris time is not to be missed. Native I. giganticaeruleas should be in full bloom and are readily accessible in their native habitat. The tour gardens will have hybrid cultivars as well.

A favorite iris to look for at Victoria Inn is a natural hybrid collected on the Fleming Plantation nearby. It is probably a cross of I. fulva and giganticaerulea and is a brilliant fuchsia.
